2 DIVISION REPORTS

2.1 Highway

- Used 515.8 gal of diesel fuel 515.8 gal was for highway and 0 was non highway use.
- Used 309.8 gal of gas 0 was highway and 309.8 was non highway use.
- Patch holes on dirt and paved roads.
- Replace driveway pipes Evergreen Lane.
- Make sand salt mix for winter.
- Repair wash out Swamp Pond, Grassy Swamp, Perry Pond and Hoffman.
- Put all summer equipment away for winter.
- Get remaining trucks ready for winter.
- Out two times for lite snow.

2.2 Water & Sewer

- Received \$22,578.75 in reimbursement for the apprentice through New York Rural Water Association.
- Completed monthly drinking water and waste water sampling and reporting.
- Made adjustments to the chlorinator at the sewer plant, as needed, to maintain Federal and State standards on the effluent wastewater.
- Did water meter readings every Wednesday in the month of November.

- Attended a class provided by NYRWA and several webinars for sewer and water education.
- Koberlein pumped out sludge from dosing tanks.
- Removed sludge and replaced fabric around sand beds.
- Replaced two broken water curb valves at 96 Kirk Rd with help from Tom Coacci.
- Marked out water and sewer lines for 1 dig request.
- Had a class on chemical handling by New York Rural Water Association.
- Dug up 70' section of water main to add insulation at the end of 2nd Ave.
- Removed water meter and turned water off to 1 location.
- Made a new caustic soda discharge line at the sewer plant due to old one clogging up.
- Made repairs to some leaking fittings at Well #3.
- Responded to a call about no water on Kirk Rd. After investigating we found water pressure to be good at the meter, determined there to be issues with plumbing in the house.
- Replaced 1 old water meter with a new meter.
- Inspected 1 water meter at a house.
- Repaired leaking hydraulic fitting on snow plow.

UDC Fiscal Sustainability Study Presentation by consultant Michael Crane. Excellent data that supports fact that as structured and funded, the UDC will shed another employee in 8 years. It's my belief that Towns have mixed and various opinions of the UDC, but prefer that it continue to exist, So in future, UDC may be asking for support from Towns, but we have not yet analyzed the study.

Delaware River Basin Commission;

Public Comment period on "Amendments to Special Regulations on High Volume Hydraulic Fracturing /proposed regulations pertain to importation of waste water into the Basin, and exportation of water from the river to fracking operations elsewhere.

UDC Director drafted comments from UDC. Since there was not a consensus to approve, our comments letter was deferred to January Meeting.

Old Business follow up;

Skinners Falls Milanville Bridge PennDOT has released their Planning and Environmental Linkages Study for a 30-day comment period from **Dec 8, through January 8.** UDC staff is preparing a comment, which will be reviewed 12/14 at WURM committee. Those who want to comment, PennDOT's contact person is Heather Gerling. For more info on how to comment, ask Ashley at UDC. The comments that come out of tonight's WURM committee would be an excellent template.

Federal Railroad Administration responded to inquiry about damaged culvert. A positive outcome, with continued dialogue happening.

Ten Mile River Access Per NPS Superintendent Joe Salvatore, their Land Acquisition Request is still active, but there are no Federal dollars until the Federal Budget's approved.

2.6 Energy Committee

HORSE Update

We took delivery of our food scrap digester "the HORSE" from Seattle on January 21st.

We had a virtual ribbon cutting on Earth Day April 22, 2021.

We spent the summer commissioning the unit.

We started to process food waste from local restaurants in late August/early September. To date, we have processed organic material from **The Heron**, **The Botanist**, **The Blue Fox** and **Pete's**. **2 Queens** and **The Laundrette** are also interested in participating as the operations continue.

We are now ending our first 3 months of **Tusten HORSE** operations with many lessons learned, nearly **a ton** of food waste processed from local restaurants, the first full tote of probiotic plant food (275 gallons), and production of our own renewable energy. We have also been working with the **Narrowsburg Ecumenical Food Pantry** to ensure that all edible food is being donated to feed people first. We thank the **Center for EcoTechnology** for being a vital partner on this project.

Our local <u>SUNY green technology department</u> is interested in scheduling a visit soon. Sullivan County Recycles staff visited on Friday November 19th and then featured the **Tusten HORSE** on its <u>Facebook page</u>.

With the first full tote of the probiotic plant food, we are finalizing local interest and markets for this valuable output in 2022. This year the TEC has given away the liquid plant food to contributors for free.

Good Find Farm has been interested from the start and wrote a grant support letter to NYS DEC when the project started; we believe they also will pick up product this week, truly closing the loop!

On deck for the Winter:

RIT case study: As reported previously, an RIT student/professor team is pursuing 2021-2022 graduate case study research about the Tusten HORSE with the goal to understand the social, environmental and financial drivers of a distributed model for food waste processing and energy production.

The TEC will develop the ongoing operations plan which is our last deliverable for the NYS DEC grant which fueled this project.

We have been contacted by many communities interested to learn from our efforts. Tusten continues to be a role model community for others and making a positive climate impact. We are offsetting climate change here and now!

Soft Plastic Recycling

In **2021**, residents and businesses in the Town of Tusten collected and dropped off **5,321 pounds** of soft plastic waste to be recycled into outdoor decking and furniture. Now instead of going to a landfill, it is recycled. A huge thank you to everyone who recycles their soft plastics.
