Public Comments. There were no public comments.

The first item on the agenda was to review and consider minutes from the meeting held on June 26, 2023. Councilmember, Russell Machann, made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Councilmember, Larry Pittman, seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The second item on the agenda was to review and consider a Resolution: A resolution of the Wharton City Council approving Amendment No. 4 to the Franchise Agreement for Solid Waste Collection Services with Green for Life and authorizing the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute the agreement. Finance Director, Joan Andel, presented a copy of the 4th Amendment and Exhibits received from Mr. David Selesky, with Green for Life (GFL), in draft form. She stated that City Attorney, Paul Webb, had reviewed the documents and found no issues. After some discussion, Councilmember, Larry Pittman, made a motion to recommend to the City Council to approve the resolution approving Amendment No. 4 to the Franchise Agreement for Solid Waste Collection Services with Green for Life. Councilmember, Russell Machann, seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The third item on the agenda was to review and consider a Resolution: A resolution of the Wharton City Council authorizing the City Staff to issue Requests for Proposals for a tax increment reinvestment zone administrator. Finance Director, Joan Andel, stated that with the progress being made with the development of Wharton 55, LLC, the City Staff was requesting that the City seek proposals for a Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone (TIRZ) administrator. She stated a few of the things the TIRZ administrator was responsible for were preparing a taxable value analysis, developing a cash flow model, preparing a financing plan as well as all necessary documentation. After some discussion, Councilmember, Russell Machann, made a motion to recommend to the City Council to approve the resolution authorizing the City Staff to issue Requests for Proposals for a tax increment reinvestment zone administrator. Councilmember, Larry Pittman, seconded the motion. All voted in favor.
