CITY OF WHARTON, TEXAS RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION CREATING THE WHARTON PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 1 IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 372 OF THE TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE; PROVIDING FOR RELATED MATTERS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City of Wharton, Texas (the "City"), is authorized by Chapter 372 of the Texas Local Government Code, as amended (the "Act"), to create a public improvement district within its corporate limits and extraterritorial jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, on July 14, 2022, Raymond C. Harrison Sr. Properties FLP, a Texas limited partnership (the "Petitioner") submitted and filed with the City Secretary for the City a petition (the "Petition") requesting the establishment of Wharton Public Improvement District No. 1 (the "District"), which is located within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Wharton, Texas and more particularly described by the metes and bounds in Exhibits A and B (the "Property"), attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City (the "City Council") has investigated and determined that the facts contained in the Petition are true and correct; and

WHEREAS, after publishing notice in the *Wharton Journal-Spectator*, a newspaper of general circulation of Wharton County and the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Wharton, Texas, and mailing notice of the hearing, all as required by and in conformity with the Act, the City Council conducted a public hearing on the advisability of the improvements on August 8, 2022; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHARTON, TEXAS:

- **Section 1.** The findings set forth in the recitals of this Resolution are hereby found to be true and correct.
- **Section 2.** The Petition submitted to the City by the Petitioner was filed with the City Secretary and complies with Section 372.005 of the Act.
- **Section 3.** Pursuant to the requirements of the Act, including, without limitation, Sections 372.006 and 372.009, the City Council, after considering the Petition and the evidence and testimony presented at the public hearing on August 8, 2022, hereby finds and declares:
- (a) <u>Advisability of the Authorized Improvements</u>. It is advisable to create the District to provide the Authorized Improvements (as described below). The Authorized Improvements are feasible and desirable and will promote the interests of the City and will confer a special benefit on the Property.
- (b) <u>General Nature of Authorized Improvements.</u> The general nature of the proposed public improvements (collectively, the "Authorized Improvements") are those permitted by the Act including, without limitation, any or all of the following to the extent permitted by the Act: (i) design, construction and other allowed costs related to street and roadway improvements, including related sidewalks, drainage, utility construction and relocation, signalization, landscaping, lighting, signage, entry monumentation, off-street parking and right-of-way; (ii) design, construction and other allowed costs related to improvement of parks and open space, together with any ancillary structures, features or amenities such as trails, playgrounds, walkways, artwork, lighting and any similar items located therein; (iii) design, construction and other allowed costs related

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to sidewalks and landscaping and hardscaping, fountains, lighting and signage; (iv) design, construction and other allowed costs related to water, wastewater and drainage (including detention); (v) acquisition, by purchase or otherwise, of real property in connection with any Authorized Improvement; (vi) design, construction and other allowed costs related to projects similar to those listed in subsections (i) - (v) above authorized by the Act, including off-site projects that provide a benefit to the Property; (vii) special supplemental services for improvement and promotion of the District that are allowed or permitted under the Act, including services relating to advertising, promotion, health and sanitation, water and wastewater, public safety, security, business recruitment, development, recreation, and cultural enhancement; (viii) payment of costs associated with establishment, administration, and operation of the District and those related to operating and maintaining the Authorized Improvements; and (x) payment of costs associated with developing and financing the Authorized Improvements, and costs of establishing, administering and operating the District. These Authorized Improvements shall promote the interests of the City and confer a special benefit upon the Property.

- (c) <u>Estimated Cost of the Authorized Improvements</u>. The estimated cost to design, acquire, and construct the Authorized Improvements, together with bond issuance costs, eligible legal and financial fees, eligible credit enhancement costs and eligible costs incurred in the establishment administration and operation of the District, is \$36,000,000.00.
- (d) <u>Boundaries of the District</u>. The District is proposed to include the contiguous Property comprising approximately 31.294 acres as stated in Exhibit A and 101.536 acres as stated in Exhibit B attached and made a part hereof.
- (e) <u>Method of Assessment</u>. The City shall levy assessments on each parcel within the District in a manner that results in imposing equal shares of the costs on property similarly benefited. All assessments may be paid in full at any time (including interest and principal), and certain assessments may be paid in annual installments (including interest and principal).
- (f) <u>Apportionment of Costs Between the District and the City.</u> The City will not be obligated to provide any funds to finance the Authorized Improvement, other than from assessments levied against the Property within the District.
- (g) <u>Management of the District</u>. The District shall be managed by the City, with the assistance of a consultant, who shall, from time to time, advise the City regarding certain operations of the District.
- (h) <u>Advisory Board</u>. The District shall be established managed without the creation of an advisory body.
- **Section 4.** The Wharton Public Improvement District No. 1 is hereby authorized and created as a public improvement district under the Act and in accordance with the findings of the City Council as to the advisability of the Authorized Improvements contained in this Resolution, the general nature of the Authorized Improvements, the estimated costs of the Authorized Improvements, the boundaries of the District, the method of assessment, the apportionment of costs as described herein, the management of the District and the advisory board; and the conclusion that the District is needed to fund such Authorized Improvements.
- **Section 5.** Not later than the seventh date the City adopts this Resolution, the City Secretary shall file a copy of this Resolution with the County Clerk of Wharton County, Texas.
- **Section 6.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and filing as required by law.

MINUTES OF CITY OF WHARTON CITY COUNCIL MEETING JUNE 13, 2022

Mayor, Tim Barker declared a Regular Meeting duly open for the transaction of business at 7:00 P.M. at City Hall 120 E. Caney Street Wharton, TX. Adraylle Watson led the opening devotion and Mayor, Tim Barker led the pledge of allegiance.

Wharton Moment.

Mayor, Tim Barker, thanked Andy Parks, with the Army Corps of Engineers, for holding a Public Meeting to discuss the status of the Wharton Flood Reduction Project – Levee.

Public Comments.

Mayor, Tim Barker, called for Public Comments. No comments were given.

The first item on the agenda was to review and consider the reading of the minutes from the regular meetings held May 9, 2022 and May 23, 2022 and special meeting held May 16, 2022. After some discussion, Councilmember, Russell Machann, moved to approve the minutes from the regular meetings held May 9, 2022 and May 23, 2022 and special meeting held May 16, 2022. Councilmember, Don Mueller, seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The second item on the agenda was to review and consider Request from Deshavian Williams, for a Juneteenth Celebration on Saturday, June 18, 2022, for the following:

1. Request for a variance to host food trucks and clothing vendors in a City Park.

City Secretary, Paula Favors, stated the event had been cancelled and the item would be pulled from the agenda. After some discussion, no action was taken.

The third item on the agenda was to review and consider a request by Mr. Stephen Wisnieski, of My Storehouse Mini Storage II, 1810 Stadium Road, Brod Acres, Block 17J-1 for an 8' variance from the required 20' side property line setback creating a 12' setback. The fourth item on the agenda was to review and consider a request from The Brooks at Caney Creek for sidewalk replacement on North Richmond Road. City Secretary, Paula Favors, stated there was not any representatives present for the item. After some discussion, no action was taken.

The fifth item on the agenda was to review and consider a resolution of the Wharton City Council approving the Annual Service Contract with Stryker Medical and authorizing the purchase of four (4) Power Pro 2 Stretchers and Stair-Pro Stair Chairs and authorizing the City Manager to execute all documents related to said purchase. E.M.S. Director, Christy Gonzales, presented a memorandum regarding the Annual Service Contract with Stryker Medical and the purchase of medical equipment and a quote from Stryker Medical for purchase of four new Power Pro 2 stretchers, Stair-PRO Stair Chairs and an updated Annual Service Contract. After some discussion, Councilmember, Russell Machann, moved to approve City of Wharton Resolution No. 2022-53, which read as follows:

CITY OF WHARTON RESOLUTION NO. 2022-53

A RESOLUTION OF THE WHARTON CITY COUNCIL APPROVING THE ANNUAL SERVICE CONTRACT WITH STRYKER MEDICAL AND AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF FOUR (4) POWER PRO 2 STRETCHERS AND STAIR-PRO STAIR CHAIRS AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE ALL DOCUMENTS RELATED TO SAID PURCHASE.

- **WHEREAS,** The Wharton Emergency Medical Services Department requests that the City Council approve the Annual Service Contract with Stryker Medical; and,
- **WHEREAS,** The Wharton City Council wishes to authorize the City Staff to purchase four (4) Power Pro 2 Stretchers and Stair-Pro Stair Chairs; and,

Cleanliness and Sanitation of Premises; Littering; Section 34-51 Accumulation or growth of weeds or brush through Section 34-55. Same-Performance by City shall read as follows:

Sec. 34-51. Accumulation or growth of weeds or brush.

- (a) Nuisance declared. It shall be unlawful for any owner(s) of any premises within the city to allow weeds, grass or uncultivated plants to grow upon such premises or to allow trash or rubbish to accumulate upon such premises to such an extent as is reasonably calculated to create a fire hazard or to become injurious to the health of the citizens. Any such act is declared to constitute a public nuisance.
- (b) Duty to cut growth.
 - (1) It shall be unlawful for any owner(s) of any premises to permit weeds, grass or uncultivated plants to grow upon such premises to a height greater than ten (10) inches on an average or to grow in rank profusion thereon. For purposes of owner(s) responsibility, it shall include, in addition to those grounds within their respective boundaries, all abutting easements and rights-of-way being adjacent thereto and extending beyond the property line of any such property to the edge of the blacktop of adjacent streets where a curb line has not been established, or to the back of the curb where curb line has been established, and also to the center of adjacent alleys, easements, and undeveloped streets. Any premises upon which any weeds, grass or uncultivated plants grow above such height or in rank profusion shall be deemed a public nuisance. Provided, however, the provisions of this subsection shall not apply to any owner(s) of any premises who has received and maintains a valid permit to grow and harvest hay within the city limits.

City Attorney

Penalty Clause

Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, any person found guilty of intentionally, knowingly or recklessly violating any provision of this article and upon conviction thereof in the municipal court shall be fined in accordance with the terms of Section 1-5 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Wharton, Texas.

Severability

If any court of competent jurisdiction rules that any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this ordinance is invalid or unconstitutional, any such portion shall be deemed to be a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and any such ruling shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

This Ordinance shall become effective on the 24th day of June, 2022 at 12:01 a.m.

DRAINAGE:

1. Stavena Addition Drainage Project.

The design and construction plans are complete. The project is one of the construction projects to be funded with the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) Flood Infrastructure Fund Program for partial assistance.

2. Ahldag Ditch Improvement.

The project was approved by the City Council. The ditch improvements were proposed under the Texas General Land Office (GLO) Infrastructure Grant Program. - (b) Members of the commission shall serve for two-year staggered terms.

If any court of competent jurisdiction rules that any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this ordinance is invalid or unconstitutional, any such portion shall be deemed to be a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and any such ruling shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.




