City Manager Andres Garza, Jr. declared a meeting of the City Council Public Works Committee duly open for the transaction of business at 5:30 p.m.

Committee Members present: Councilmember Don Mueller, Councilmember

Clifford Jackson and Councilmember Terry Freese.

Committee Member absent: None.

Staff Members present: City Manager Andres Garza, Jr., Finance Director

Joan Andel, Assistant to the City Manager Brandi Jimenez, Community Development Director Gwyneth Teves and Public Works Director John

Plaia.

Staff Members absent: None.

Visitors present: Mayor Tim Barker, Mr. Stephen Swindell-Jones and

Carter and Mr. Chad Odom-Wharton Economic Development Corporation Executive Director.

Public comments. There were no public comments.

The first item on the agenda was to review and consider minutes from the meeting held May 19, 2020. Councilmember Don Mueller made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Councilmember Terry Freese seconded. All voted in favor.

The second item on the agenda was to review and consider a Resolution: A resolution of the Wharton City Council awarding a contract to aftermath structural repairs for the Emergency Structural Repairs to the Santa Fe Outfall Structure and authorizing the Mayor of the city of Wharton to execute all documents relating to said contract. Community Development Director Gwyn Teves stated that during Hurricane Harvey in 2017 the Santa Fe Outfall received damage. She stated that the City Staff had been working with Jones and Carter and the United States Army Corp of Engineers (USACE) on the status and repairs of the Outfall. She stated that the USACE had been working on getting a team to come inspect and eventually repair the outfall, however, in the meantime, Jones and Carter has been doing inspections after each major rain event or high water event and has located a crack in the structure that could result in sudden and catastrophic failure of the structure. She stated upon notification to the USACE of this problem, they were unable to provide a timeline on any repairs to be made and our consultant who was formerly with the USACE had advised the funding and repair process could possibly take up to 2 years and this would not be acceptable under the current circumstances. She stated that Jones & Carter was contracted for the Santa Fe Outfall and had requested quotes from contractors who are able

to perform the emergency repairs. She stated that they were only able to locate one contractor who could provide the repairs needed. After some discussion, Councilmember Terry Freese made a motion to recommend to the City Council the approval of the emergency repairs to the Santa Fe Outfall. Councilmember Don Mueller seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The third item on the agenda was adjournment. Councilmember Don Mueller moved to adjourn. Councilmember Clifford Jackson seconded. All voted in favor. The meeting adjourned at 6:30 p.m.

RE: Resurfacing & Restriping of Highway 60

Dear Mr. Garza,

In an effort to address traffic concerns in historic downtown Wharton, members of our board along with Gwyneth Teves from your staff met some months ago with representatives from TxDOT. During the meeting, a suggestion was made by TxDOT staff to consider restriping Hwy 60 as it traverses the historic district to a single lane allowing for broader shoulders. This restriping would potentially reduce the speed with which thru traffic moves and also increase pedestrian safety.

Subsequently, members of our board have had individual discussions with stakeholders in the district as well as presented the suggestion for consideration at two different general membership meetings. The suggestion has been so well received that at the general meeting held on Tuesday, July 30, the group unanimously passed a motion to submit this request to the City.

We understand that TxDOT will be resurfacing business Highway 60 through Wharton in 2020 and request that the City make formal request for restriping Milam and Burleson streets through the historic downtown area to a single lane on each street allowing for wider shoulders. Further, we request that the city evaluate parking in the historic downtown with an eye for eliminating spaces very near the end of each block. It is felt that these impede visibility and potentially pose a threat to safety.

Yes, absolutely. I spoke with Ryan Simper at TxDOT as recently as last week as I've been trying to keep abreast of the timeline so we can let local merchants know when the road construction will start. It was during that conversation that he mentioned the request did not include Burleson. I reiterated that I thought we'd talked about Burleson and he confirmed we had and it would be no problem but that is

not what the request from the city stated. I understood from him during that recent conversation that he did not anticipate any problem with including Burleson. Thank you for getting back before the council.

I do have one other question along a similar line. The APA report recently adopted by the Council addresses safety and curb appeal at the intersection of Milam and Richmond Road. We agree. Are there plans to improve the appearance, visibility and safety at this intersection similar to what is depicted in the report (see p. 39, "After the Floods: Planning for Community, Connections, and Resilience")?

I have visited again with the primary business owners there and they remain hopeful that Burleson would, along with Milam, be restriped to a single lane.

You will recall that this restriping idea was initially offered by TxDOT as a means of improving pedestrian safety, slowing vehicular traffic and reducing noise in this area.

We know that the project will start soon and are hopeful that the city will amend their request to TxDOT so that both down thoroughfares are striped to a single lane.

- Hurricane Harvey State Mitigation Competition Round 1 (\$1 billion of \$2,144,776,720 total)

On Monday, June 15th, the City of Wharton received bids for the 2020 Street Program Improvements Project. There were five (5) bids received with base bids ranging from \$726,670.02 to \$919,310.73. Included in the bid was one alternate for an alternative material. This alternate material cost provides the City with options should the project be met with adverse weather conditions or isolated situations where the alternate material would be more suitable for constructability. Including this alternate the bids range from \$726,670.02 to \$970,519.02. The low bidder for both the base bid and additive alternate bid item is Fuquay, Inc. At this time BEFCO does not recommend awarding the alternate bid as its use will only be incorporated if required.

We recommend that the City award the 2020 Street Program Improvements Project to the low bidder, Fuguay, Inc. in the amount of \$726,670.02 for the Base Bid.
