SUBJECT: Water Utility Service Agreement with Russell J. Baird for the Baird

Subdivision

Mr. Baird has been remodeling his buildings in downtown Wharton and has been working to revitalize them for the economic advantage of the downtown area. City staff has been working with Mr. Baird to assist with the utilities on his property to allow for the properties to be portioned out as single units.

Mr. Baird has been working with City Staff to extend independent water service to each building and at the meeting on June 27, 2022, easements were established for utilities. Mr. Baird is now requesting to work with the City to extend the water service behind the buildings and enter into a Water Utility Service Agreement for the City to bid out services to install the water utilities. The bids provided to Public Works Director Anthony Arcidiacono have both come in just under \$40,000 but contractors will not guarantee bids longer than 7 days due to the changes in the market. Mr. Baird and staff are recommending the agreement be set at \$40,000 and if the work is completed for less, he will be reimbursed the remaining funds, or if the bids come in higher, Mr. Baird will be informed, and an amendment may be required.

Attached are the draft agreement and resolutions to enter into the agreement. The agreement has been reviewed by the City Attorney and meet with their approval. It is my recommendation that the Council consider approving this agreement at this time.

CUSTOMER-DEVELOPER WATER UTILITY SERVICE AGREEMENT

		KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:
COUNTY OF WHARTON	§	

THIS AGREEMENT between the CITY OF WHARTON, a Municipal Corporation, acting by and through its Mayor, situated in Wharton County, Texas, (hereinafter referred to as "City"), and RUSSELL J. BAIRD, hereinafter referred to as ("Customer–Developer"), acting by and through himself, is as follows:

WITNESSETH:

- 1. Customer Developer desires to have the City extend a two (2) inch public, potable, domestic water main. The improvements Customer–Developer desires to have constructed to the location are shown in the Project site plan attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and are as follows: A two (2) inch water main extension to the Property with _______ to the Property line in accordance with the City of Wharton specifications and professional civil engineering standards.
- 2. Customer–Developer hereby agrees that it will bear the entire cost of the installation, including all actual engineering costs and construction materials and labor ("Project Cost") associated with the afore-mentioned improvements. The payment to the City shall be in accordance with the attached Exhibit "B" and shall be as follows: Customer–Developer will initially pay \$40,000 upon execution of this Agreement, which represents the City consulting engineer's estimated engineering, construction, and contingency fund costs for the water main Project. The City will publicly and competitively bid the construction of these facilities and after the City has received bids, Customer–Developer agrees to pay the amount, if any, by which the competitively bid Project Cost exceeds the City's initial estimated Project Cost (\$40,000), based on the lowest responsive and best acceptable bid, and such potential additional Customer-Developer payment to City must be received before the City awards the construction contract and authorizes the contractor to commence work.
- 3. Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, in the event the lowest responsive and best acceptable competitive bid for the construction portion of the

Project <u>only</u>, is in excess of \$40,000 the City of Wharton shall notify Customer—Developer in writing and Customer—Developer shall have ten (10) calendar days from the date of such notice to rescind this Agreement. Upon any rescission of the Agreement, Customer-Developer and the City of Wharton agree that the City shall promptly return to Customer–Developer the initial \$40,000 payment, <u>less</u> any documented costs for previous City consulting engineering, legal, and bid advertising fees and other reasonable City administrative costs incurred.

- 4. If, at the completion of the construction, it is determined that Customer–Developer has paid more than the actual final cost of the Project, after factoring in and accounting for any reasonable Change Orders approved by the City and the City's consulting engineer (the "Actual Adjusted Project Cost"), the City agrees to reimburse any overpayment to Customer-Developer. Customer-Developer reserves a right to audit the Project costs incurred by the City.

STANDARD PROVISIONS

- 6. <u>Remedies</u>. The remedies available to the City and the Customer-Developer under this Agreement, and the laws of Texas, are cumulative in nature. The exercise of any one right or remedy shall be without prejudice to the enforcement of any other right or remedy allowed at law or in equity. Any material misrepresentation or failure by either Party to fully disclose all relevant facts regarding the Project or connection and service requirements to the Property shall be a breach of this Agreement.
- 7. Third Party Rights. No person or entity who or which is not a party to this Agreement shall have any right of action under this Agreement, nor shall any such person or entity other than the City (including without limitation a trustee in bankruptcy) have any interest in or claim to the contractor's construction Performance Bond.
- 8. <u>No Waiver</u>. No waiver of any provision of this Agreement will be deemed to constitute a waiver of any other provision, nor will it be deemed or constitute a continuing waiver

unless expressly provided for by a written amendment to this Agreement; nor will the waiver of any default under this Agreement be deemed a waiver of any subsequent defaults of the same type. The failure at any time by either Party to enforce this Agreement or covenant by the Party, its successors, or assigns, whether any violations thereof are known or not, shall not constitute a waiver or estoppel of the right to do so.

- 9. Attorney's Fees. Should either Party be required to resort to litigation to enforce or interpret the terms of this Agreement, the prevailing Party, plaintiff, or defendant, shall be entitled to recover its costs, including reasonable attorney's fees, court costs, and expert witness fees, from the other Party. If the court awards relief to both Parties, each will bear its own costs in their entirety.
- 10. <u>Assignability</u>. The benefits and burdens of this Agreement are corporate obligations of the Customer-Developer and also are binding on its heirs, successors, and assigns. The Customer-Developer's obligations under this Agreement may not be assigned without the express written approval of the City. The City's written approval may not be withheld if the Customer-Developer's assignee explicitly assumes all obligations of the Customer-Developer under this Agreement. The City may not assign any or all of its rights under this Agreement without the express written approval of the Customer-Developer, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 11. <u>Notice</u>. Any notice required or permitted by this Agreement is effective when personally delivered in writing, or three (3) business days after notice is deposited with the U.S. Postal Service, postage prepaid, certified with return receipt requested, and addressed to the Parties at their respective addresses set forth on the signature page of this Agreement.
- 12. <u>Severability</u>. If any part, term, or provision of this Agreement is held by a Court to be illegal, invalid, or otherwise unenforceable, such illegality, invalidity, or enforceability shall not affect the validity of any other part, term, or provision, and the rights of the Parties will be construed as if the part, term, or provision was never part of this Agreement.
- 13. <u>Personal Jurisdiction and Venue</u>. Personal jurisdiction and venue for any civil action commenced by either Party to this Agreement, whether arising out of or relating to the Agreement, will be deemed to be proper only if such action is commenced in the Courts of Wharton County, Texas. The Customer-Developer expressly waives any right to bring such an action in or to remove such an action to any other trial court.
- 14. <u>Captions Immaterial</u>. The numbering, order, and captions or headings of the paragraphs of this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not be considered in construing the intent of this Agreement.
- 15. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Parties and correctly sets forth the rights, duties, and obligations of each to the other as of the Effective Date. Any oral representations or modifications concerning this Agreement

shall be of no force or effect, excepting a subsequent written modification executed by both Parties.

- 16. <u>Authorization to Complete Agreement Blanks</u>. By signing and delivering this Agreement to the appropriate official of the City, the Customer-Developer authorizes completion of this Agreement by the City accurately filling in the Effective Date below and providing a conformed copy to the Customer-Developer.
- 17. <u>Binding Agreement</u>. The execution and delivery of this Agreement and the performance of the transactions contemplated thereby, have been duly authorized by all necessary private corporate, municipal corporate, and governmental actions of the appropriate Party. This Agreement has been duly executed and delivered by each Party, and constitutes a legal, valid, and binding obligation of each Party enforceable in accordance with the terms as of the Effective Date.
- 18. Governing Law. This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Texas.
- 19. <u>Survival</u>. Any and all representations, conditions and warranties made by either Party under this Agreement are **OF THE ESSENCE** of this Agreement and shall survive the execution, delivery and termination of it; and the construction by City's independent contractor and final acceptance of the Project Improvement(s) by the City; and all statements contained in any document required by the City from Customer-Developer or by the Customer-Developer from the City, whether delivered at the time of the Agreement execution, or at a later date, shall constitute representations and warranties hereunder.
- 20. <u>Force Majeure</u>. In the event that either Party shall be prevented from completing performance of its Project Contract obligations and undertakings under this Agreement by an act of God or other occurrence whatsoever, which is beyond the reasonable control of such Party, then assuming that the adversely affected Party has made reasonable efforts to remove or mitigate the force majeure, that Party shall be excused from any further performance of its obligations and undertakings until such time as the force majeure no longer prevents it from performing, at which point it shall give the other Party prompt notice of its intent to resume such performance.
- 21. Warranty. The City warrants that the Project Improvements constructed by City's independent contractor will be free from defects for a period of one (1) year from the date the City accepts the completion of the Project (the "Warranty Period"), except the City does not warrant the Project Improvements for defects caused by events outside the control of the City or the City's contractor. The City, through its independent contractor, agrees to repair any damage to the Project Improvements before and during the Warranty Period. After the construction warranty expires, the City will assume all traditional operation and maintenance responsibilities associated with owning a component of a Texas municipal water supply system.

- 22. <u>Bonding</u>. The City agrees to require the City's independent contractor to provide the City a Performance Bond in accordance with Texas law and acceptable to the City, in the full amount of the total construction contract price. The City agrees to require the contractor to provide the City a Payment Bond in the same amount as the Performance Bond, to protect all claimants supplying labor and materials in the construction of the Project Improvements.
- 23. <u>Notice of Defect</u>. The City will provide written notice to the Customer-Developer whenever City inspection reveals that the Project Improvements are not constructed or completed in accordance with the design standards and specifications for public water main health or safety, the Construction Documents or any applicable law or regulation, and the Customer-Developer shall notify the City whenever it independently discovers any such construction defects. The City will then pursue appropriate remedies against its independent construction contractor to remedy any such construction defects.
- 24. <u>Demand on Surety</u>. The City may make demand upon City contractor's performance bond surety due to contractor's failure to construct the Project Improvements in accordance with the Construction Documents.
- 25. <u>Transfer of Ownership and Assumption of Service Maintenance</u>. The City will accept for permanent ownership, public maintenance and operations, all <u>off-site</u> public water main improvements, when the construction has been tested and accepted by the City.
- 26. Reservation of City's Rights to Place Project Improvements into Service. If, in the reasonable opinion of the City and its engineering consultant: the construction of the Project Improvements by City's contractor does not meet the design and performance standards set forth in the Construction Documents; or Customer-Developer is in material violation of any ordinance of the City of Wharton or other applicable law or regulation pertaining to this water main Project or the use of such water main; or Customer-Developer is in default of this Agreement; the City may choose not to immediately provide potable water service through the new public water main Project Improvements until the above conditions are remedied.

CITY OF WHARTON ORDINANCE NO. 2022-XX

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF WHARTON CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 2, ADMINISTRATION, ARTICLE V, DIVISION 2, BEAUTIFICATION CITY COMMISSION, SECTION 2-122.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Wharton, Texas, that Chapter 2, Administration, Article V, Division 2, Beautification City Commission, Section 2-122 be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-122. - Membership.

- (a) The beautification city commission shall be comprised of seven members to be appointed by the city council and shall be residents of the city or shall have businesses in the city.

 Two-One of the seven members of the commission shall be recommended for appointment to the city council by the Wharton Chamber of Commerce (one member)—and the Downtown Business Association (one member).
- (b) Members of the commission shall serve for two-year staggered terms.

Severability

If any court of competent jurisdiction rules that any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this ordinance is invalid or unconstitutional, any such portion shall be deemed to be a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and any such ruling shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Passage and Approval

PASSED AND APPROVED by the City Council of the City of Wharton, Texas, on the 11^{th} day of July 2022.
