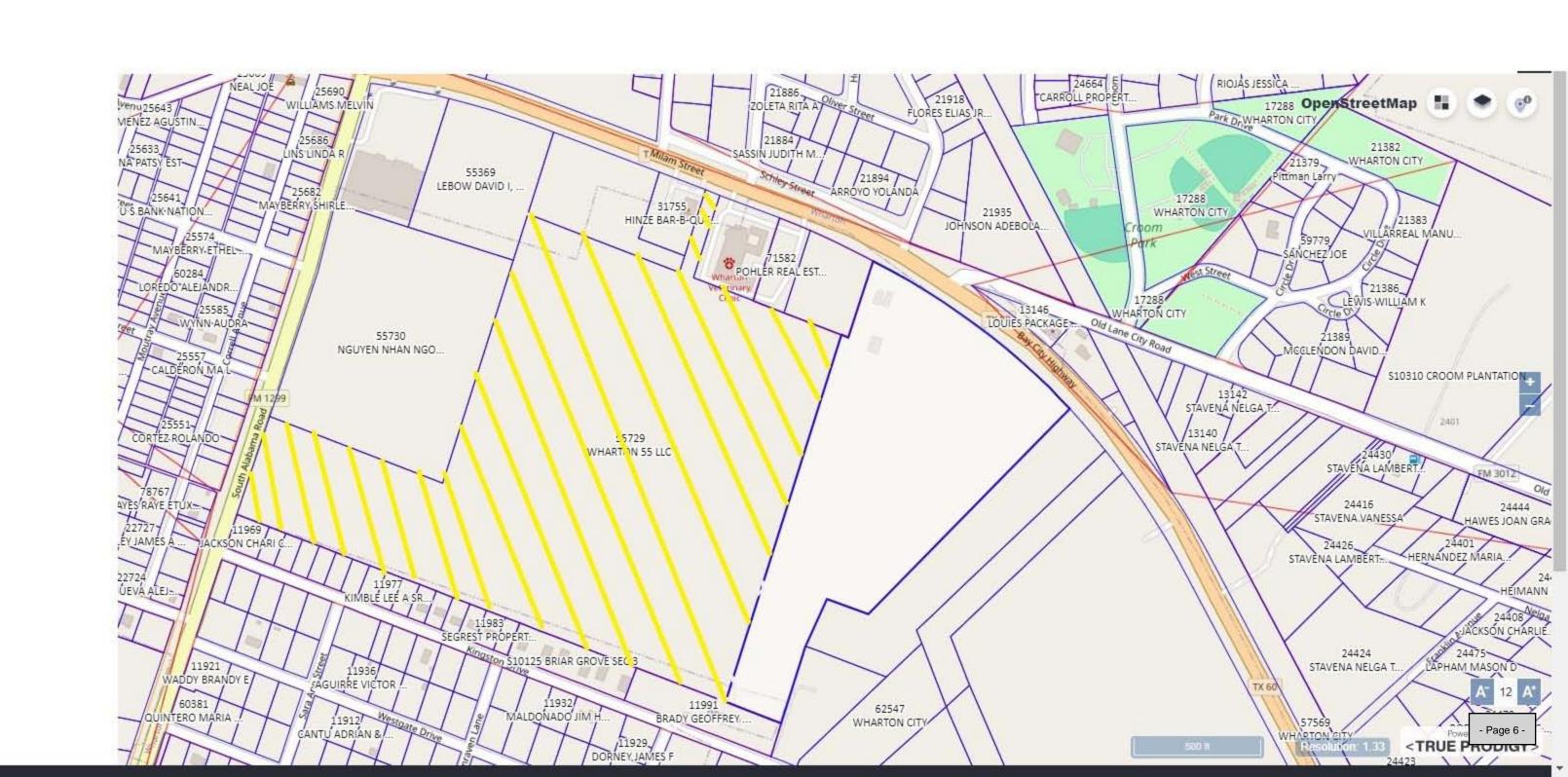

MINUTES OF CITY OF WHARTON CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING DECEMBER 11, 2023

Mayor, Tim Barker declared a Regular Meeting duly open for the transaction of business at 7:00 P.M. at City Hall 120 E. Caney Street Wharton, TX. Councilmember, Burnell Neal, led the opening devotion, and Mayor, Tim Barker led the pledge of allegiance.

Councilmembers present were: Mayor, Tim Barker, and Councilmembers, Terry Freese;

Don Mueller; Russell Machann; Burnell Neal; Larry

Pittman, and Steve Schneider.

Councilmembers absent were: None.

Staff members present were: City Manager, Joseph R. Pace; City Attorney, Paul Webb;

Roll Call and Excused Absences.

All Councilmembers were present.

Public Comments.

Mayor, Tim Barker, called for Public Comments.

1. Mr. David Bowlin provided a status update on the three affordable housing projects in design or under construction at 500 Abell Street, 398 Hamilton and 1113 College.

Wharton Moment.

Mayor, Tim Barker, called for Wharton Moments.

1. Councilmember Burnell Neal congratulated the Just Do It Now, Inc. youth football ball team and cheerleaders for winning the Super Bowl. Councilmember Neal presented the team with championship rings and spoke of how proud he was of them.

Review and Consider:

The first item on the agenda was to review and consider the reading of the minutes from the regular meetings held on November 13, 2023, and November 27, 2023. After some discussion, Councilmember, Russell Machann, moved to approve the reading of the minutes from the regular

meetings held November 13, 2023, and November 27, 2023. Councilmember, Don Mueller, seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The second item on the agenda was to review and consider an ordinance of the City Council of the City of Wharton, Texas approving a Project and Financing Plan for Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone Number One, City of Wharton, Texas established pursuant to Chapter 311 of the Texas Tax Code. On November 27, 2023, the City Council approved Ordinance 2023-13 designating a contiguous geographic area within the City Limits and within the Extraterritorial Jurisdiction of the City as a Reinvestment Zone pursuant to Chapter 311 of the Texas Tax Code to be known as Reinvestment Zone Number One, City of Wharton. Finance Director, Joan Andel stated it was necessary for the City Council to approve the ordinance, which included a Project and Financing Plan for the Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone Number One to become effective. After some discussion, Councilmember, Russell Machann, moved to approve City of Wharton Ordinance No. 2023-14, which read as follows:

CITY OF WHARTON, TEXAS ORDINANCE NO. 2023-14

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHARTON, TEXAS, APPROVING A PROJECT AND FINANCING PLAN FOR TAX INCREMENT REINVESTMENT ZONE NUMBER ONE, CITY OF WHARTON, TEXAS, ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 311 OF THE TEXAS TAX CODE

WHEREAS, the City of Wharton, Texas (the "City"), pursuant to Chapter 311 of the Texas Tax Code, as amended (the "Act"), may designate a geographic area within the City or the extraterritorial jurisdiction (the "ETJ") of the municipality as a tax increment reinvestment zone if the area satisfies the requirements of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that the governing body of a municipality by ordinance may designate a contiguous geographic area that is in the corporate limits of the municipality or the extraterritorial jurisdiction (the "ETJ") of the municipality to be a reinvestment zone if the governing body determines that development or redevelopment would not occur solely through private investment in the reasonably foreseeable future; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to promote the development of a certain contiguous geographic area in the City and the City's ETJ, through the creation of a reinvestment zone as authorized by and in accordance with the Tax Increment Financing Act, codified in Chapter 311 of the Texas Tax Code; and

WHEREAS, on November 27, 2023, the City Council of the City of Wharton, Texas, pursuant to Chapter 311 of the Texas Tax Code, approved Ordinance No. 2023-13 designating a contiguous geographic area within the City and the City's ETJ as a Reinvestment Zone Number One, City of Wharton, Texas (the "Zone"); and

WHEREAS, as authorized by Section 311.011(e), and 311.008, of the Act, on December 11, 2023, the Board recommended that the Plan in Exhibit "A", be approved by the City Council:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLYDE, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. RECITALS INCORPORATED.

The facts and recitations contained in the preamble of this Ordinance are hereby found and declared to be true and correct.

SECTION 2. FINDINGS.

That the City Council hereby makes the following findings of fact:

- i. That the Plan includes all information required by Sections 311.011(b) and (c) of the Act.
- ii. That the Plan is feasible and the project plan conforms to the City's master plan.

SECTION 3. APPROVAL OF PLAN.

That based on the findings set forth in Section 2 of this Ordinance, the Plan in Exhibit "A" is hereby approved.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.

Should any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it is expressly provided that any and all remaining portions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. The City hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, clause, or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, and phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 5. OPEN MEETINGS.

It is hereby found, determined, and declared that sufficient written notice of the date, hour, place, and subject of the meeting of the City Council at which this Ordinance was adopted was posted at a place convenient and readily accessible at all times to the general public at the City Hall of the City for the time required by law preceding its meeting, as required by Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code, and that this meeting has been open to the public as required by law at all times during which this Ordinance and the subject matter hereof has been discussed, considered and formally acted upon. The City Council further ratifies, approves, and confirms such written notice and the contents and posting thereof.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.

Economic and Market Commentary: Cutting through the noise

December 1, 2023

Perhaps Bloomberg should create a Fickle Index. Or an Overreaction Indicator. The Volatility Index (VIX) and the Merrill Lynch Option Volatility Estimate (MOVE) capture market turbulence, but November brought yet another case of the capriciousness of the financial markets during this Federal Reserve tightening cycle.

It seemed sanguine investors had finally capitulated in early fall after the Fed's September Summary of Economic Projections (SEP) showed an additional quarter-point hike by year-end and raised the median rate for 2024 (5.1%) and 2025 (3.9%). In October, gloom pervaded. A surge in long-term Treasury yields indicated markets felt that the Fed's push to vanquish inflation would send the U.S. economy into recession.

Then came the November Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) meeting, in which the policymakers again held the target range at 5.25-50%. Investors viewed this as dovish, even though Chair Jerome Powell stated they would not consider the rise in long-term yields a substitute for policy action. After further declines of the major measures of inflation, softening tone of some Fed speakers and deteriorating employment data, investors completed their sharp shift. Fed funds futures went from anticipating modest easing in 2024 to predicting four quarter-point cuts. Stocks and bonds rallied. Perhaps a Whiplash Index is also in order.

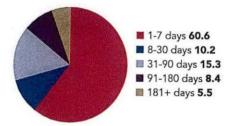

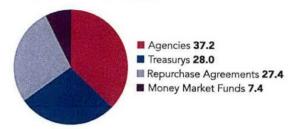
Portfolio by Maturity (%)

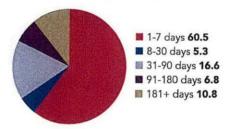

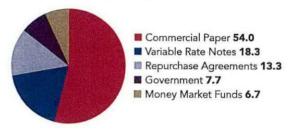

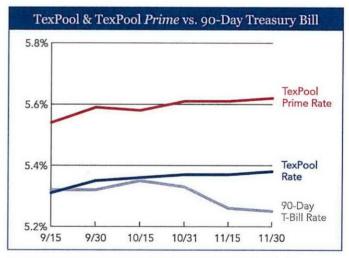

We don't think the about-face is justified. Again and again, policymakers have pushed back on wishful thinking. At the Jackson Hole symposium, Powell even took the time to squash the notion that they secretly adjusted their inflation target from 2% to 3%. The markets are hoping for a Grand Teton-like peak in rates; we think it will resemble Mesa Verde. So, we are positioning our portfolios for a higher-for-longer scenario, expecting a rate cut only in late 2024. The strength of the economy—recently the Commerce Department revised third-quarter gross domestic product (GDP) growth up to a robust 5.2%—supports that stance.

The November jobs report will be crucial. Not so much for the FOMC decision on Dec. 13, which will almost certainly result in no change, but for the updated SEP, which forecasts rates, GDP, labor and inflation. Our positioning will be based on that critical release, regardless of whether or not the markets ignore it.

Let's not forget that the ongoing reduction of the Fed's balance sheet is contractionary. This consistent collateral, combined with the Treasury Department's vast bill issuance of late, is offering cash managers attractive yields.

At the end of the month, yields on 1-, 3-, 6- and 12-month U.S. Treasuries were 5.39%, 5.40%, 5.40% and 5.13%, respectively; the 1-, 3-, 6- and 12-month Bloomberg Short-Term Bank Yield Index rates (BSBY) were 5.37%, 5.57%, 5.65% and 5.70%, respectively.

SUBJECT: Variance for Hay Lot Permit for the Hawes Family.

The Code Enforcement Department has spoken with Mr. Paul Webb regarding the following properties owned by the Hawes Family in regards to obtaining a Hay Lot Variance. Attached is the information for each property, the percentage of each person's ownership, the maps of what would be the hay lots if approved, and the city ordinance.

The variances needed would be to allow them to obtain the permit after the due date of December 31, 2023, according to the city ordinance, and to allow them to obtain said permit for each area to grow and harvest hay.

Sec. 34-51. Accumulation or growth of weeds or brush.

- (3) The requirements for receiving and maintaining a valid permit to grow and harvest hay within the city limits are:
 - a. Applications for permits shall be obtained by the owner(s) of the property upon forms provided by the code enforcement department and shall contain or have attached thereto information including, but not necessarily limited to, the following:
 - 1. Name, address and telephone number of the owner(s) and/or entity holding any lien against the premises.
 - 2. The legal property description (lot and block number) of the premises and the amount of acreage per contiguous lot.
 - b. Permits shall be issued upon the payment of a fee of \$20.00 per contiguous five acre or greater meadow and each permit shall be valid for one calendar year, expiring on December 31st.

 Permits shall be renewed annually upon the payment of an annual fee of \$20.00 per approved meadow and before December 31st of the next calendar year. If a permit is not obtained prior to the deadline date, the property shall no longer be considered as a hay meadow and shall be subjected to the requirements of this section in its entirety until a hay permit is issued for the following year.
 - c. Hay cannot be stored on a meadow within the city limits if the permitted parcel is adjacent to a developed property, residential or commercial, and must be removed within seven days after the hay is harvested.
 - d. All hay meadows must be cut and harvested a minimum of two times during the calendar year. Additionally, the meadow shall be mowed within ten days after the first frost and shall be maintained at a height not to exceed ten inches, and in accordance with section subsection 34-51(b)(1), set forth above until the next harvesting season begins.
 - e. Notwithstanding any provision contained herein to the contrary, the use of meadows for harvesting hay shall not excuse the requirement that a width of at least ten feet between property lines shall be kept mowed below the required ten inch height at all times if the permitted parcel is adjacent to a developed property, residential or commercial.
 - f. Any violation of any applicable section of this article shall result in the revocation of the permit for the remainder of the permitted year and consideration of any violations may reflect the issuance of permit in the future.
- (c) Partial exception. With respect to lots or parcels of land of contiguous five acres or more under single ownership, the provision of this section shall not be applicable to the area in excess of ten feet from any open public street or alley or to the area in excess of ten feet from any adjacent property under different ownership on which habitable structures are located. Lot and parcels of the land less than five acres must be maintained in accordance with this subsection 34-51(b)(1), set for above.

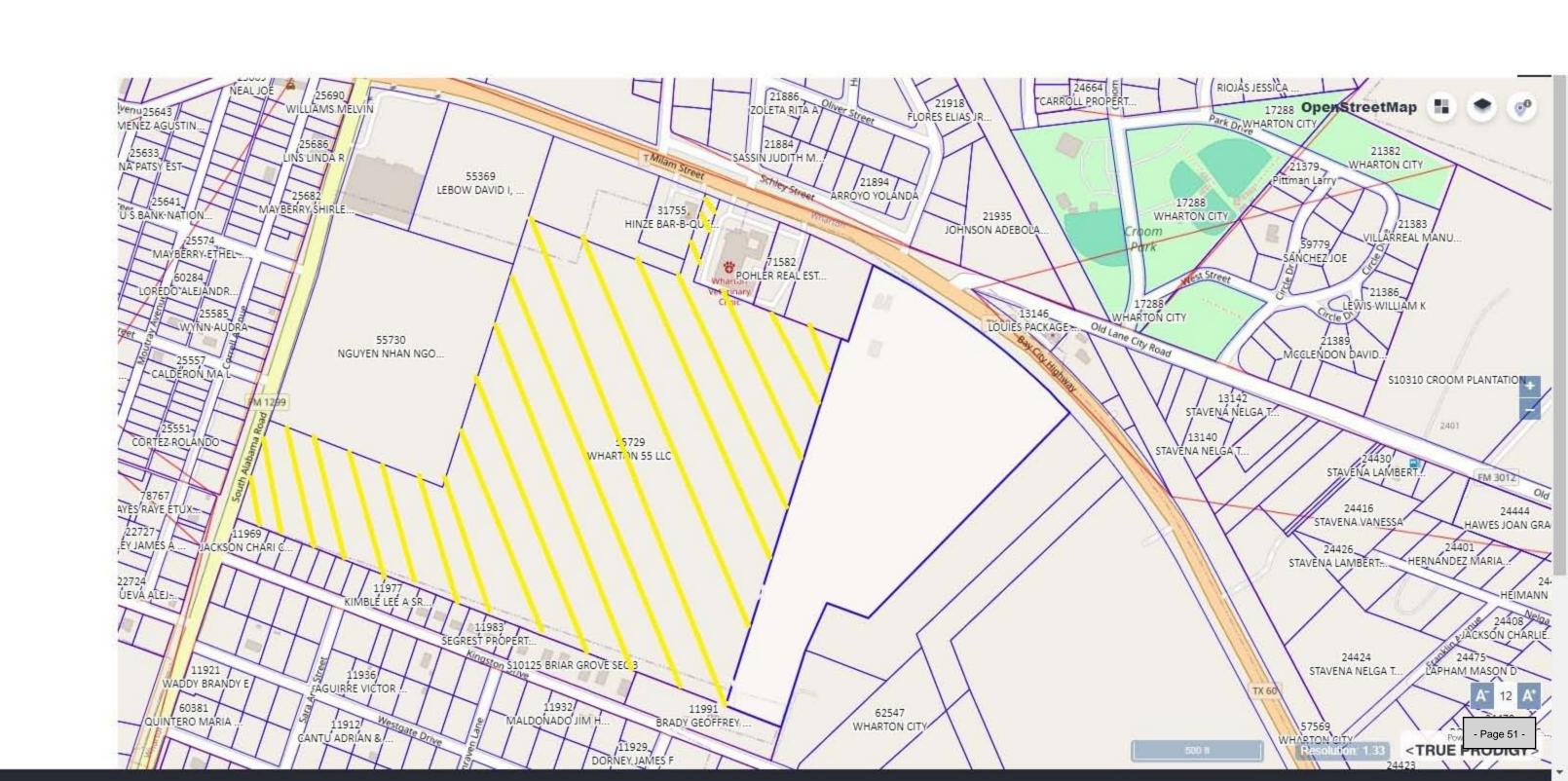

This Agreement is entered into pursuant to Section 43.0672 of the Texas Local Government Code by and between the City of Wharton, Texas (the "City") and the undersigned property owner(s) (the "Owner"). The term "Owner" includes all owners of the Property.

WHEREAS, the Owner owns a parcel of real property (the "Property") in Wharton, Wharton County, Texas, which is more particularly and separately described in the attached Exhibit "A"; and,

WHEREAS, the City has begun the process to institute annexation proceedings on all or portions of the Owner's Property and will hold a public hearing on January 8, 2024, and,

WHEREAS, this Agreement is entered into pursuant to Sections 43.0672 of the Texas Local Government Code, in order to address the desires of the Owner and the procedures of the City; and,

WHEREAS, the Owner and the City acknowledge that this Agreement is binding upon the City and the Owner and their respective successors and assigns for the term (defined below) of this Agreement; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Section 1.

ANNEXATION SERVICE PLANS CITY OF WHARTON, TEXAS MUNICIPAL SERVICE PLAN

TERRITORY

This Service Plan is applicable to the territory which is described in Exhibit A attached to this document, which is being annexed by the City of Wharton, Texas.

INTENT

It is the intent of the City of Wharton that this Service Plan shall provide for the delivery of full available municipal services to the annexed areas in accordance with State law. The failure of this plan to describe any particular service shall not be deemed to be an attempt to omit the provision of such services from the annexed areas. The delivery of municipal services may be accomplished through any means permitted by law.

EFFECTIVE TERM

This Service Plan shall be in effect for a ten-year period commencing on the effective date of this annexation.

AMENDMENT OR RENEWAL

This Service Plan may be amended from time to time as provided by the Texas Local Government Code, Section 43.056 (e), (j), and (k). Renewal of the Service Plan shall be at the sole option of the Wharton City Council.

FIRE

Existing Services: Wharton Volunteer Fire Department

Services to be Provided: Fire suppression will be available to the area upon annexation. Primary fire response will be provided by the Wharton Voluntary Fire Department, located at 319 N Fulton Wharton, TX 77488. Adequate fire suppression activities can be afforded to the annexed area within the current budget appropriation. Fire prevention activities will be provided by the Fire Marshall's office as needed.

POLICE

Existing Services: Wharton County Sheriff's Department

Services to be Provided: Currently, the area is under the jurisdiction of the Wharton County Sheriff's Office. However, upon annexation, the City of Wharton Police Department will extend regular and routine patrols to the area. It is anticipated that the implementation of police patrol activities can be effectively accommodated within the current budget and staff appropriation.

BUILDING INSPECTION

Existing Services: Wharton County Permit Department

Services to be Provided: The Building Inspection Department will provide Code Enforcement Services upon annexation. This includes issuing building, electrical, and plumbing permits for any new construction and remodeling, and enforcing all other applicable codes that regulate building construction within the City of Wharton.

PLANNING AND ZONING

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: The City of Wharton does not have zoning.

LIBRARY

Existing Services: Wharton County

Services to be Provided: Library serves will continue to be provided by Wharton County.

HEALTH DEPARTMENT- HEALTH CODE ENFORCEMENT SERVICE

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: The Texas Department of Health and Human Services will implement the enforcement of the State of Texas' health ordinances and regulations on the effective date of the annexation.

ANIMAL CONTROL

Existing Services: None

Animal control services will be provided to the area as needed by the Wharton Police Department.

STREET

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: Developers will provide streets at their own expense and will be inspected by the City of Wharton Engineers at time of completion(s). The City of Wharton will then maintain the streets(s) upon approval. Maintenance to the street(s) will be provided by the City of Wharton upon the effective date of the annexation. This service can be provided within the current budget appropriation.

STORM WATER MANAGEMENT

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: Developers will provide storm water drainage at their own expense and will be inspected by the City of Wharton Engineers at time of completions. The City of Wharton will then maintain the drainage upon approval.

STREET LIGHTING

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: The City of Wharton will coordinate any request for improved street lighting with the local electric provider in accordance with standard City of Wharton policy.

TRAFFIC ENGINEERING

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: The City of Wharton Public Works Department provide, after the effective date of annexation, any additional traffic control devices per City of Wharton requirements.

WATER SERVICE

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: Water service to the area will be provided in accordance with the applicable codes and departmental policy. When other property develops in the adjacent area, water service shall be provided in accordance with extension ordinances. Extension of service shall comply with City of Wharton codes and ordinances.

SANITARY SEWER SERVICE

Existing Services: None

Services to be Provided: Sanitary sewer service to the area of proposed annexation will be provided in accordance with applicable codes and departmental policy. Buyer agrees that it will indemnify and hold harmless WPI, its officers, agents and employees, from and against any and all claims, losses, damages, causes of action, suits and liabilities of every kind, including all expenses of litigation, court costs and attorney's fees, forfeiture of an oil, gas or mineral lease, damage to a producing reservoir or lease operations of lost production, denied certificate of occupancy or "Green Tag" from the local "AHJ", arising out of, or in any way connected with the failure of, or the operation of the equipment sold by WPI, unless WPI is proven in court to be 100% solely negligent in its responsibilities.

10. Consequential Damages and Other Charges

WPI will not be responsible or liable for any special, direct, indirect or consequential damages or for any operational interruptions or delays, production loss, or other damages or claims of whatever kind caused by or arising out of the fabrication, manufacture, sale, delivery, installation, use, breakage or performance of equipment sold or any part thereof, except only to the extent and in the manner set out in Item 12 below having to do with warranty.

11. Performance Guarantee

Performance is subject to manufacturer's guarantees for horsepower and capacities and is subject to de-rating for actual site conditions.

12. Comments and Exceptions

When Buyer's specifications are attached to or referenced in an invitation to quote, WPI makes a thorough and sincere effort to review these and provide a quote based on WPI's interpretation of the Buyer's specification. WPI's quote will clearly state what is included and what our interpretation is of Buyer's requirements. It is the Buyer's responsibility to review WPI's quote carefully and advise WPI of any discrepancies between Buyer's specification and WPI's quote. WPI's quote constitutes WPI's total offer and only those items; procedures, scope and content clearly stated in the quote are included and WPI makes no guarantee that the products quoted will meet the Buyer's specifications.

WPI warrants that the equipment of its own fabrication shall be free from defects in design, material, workmanship and title, under normal use, service, and operating conditions, for the period of one (1) year from date of start-up or commissioning or eighteen (18) months from date of shipment. WPI's exclusive remedy for breach of this warranty shall be repair or replacement of any defective parts packaged by WPI, F.O.B. Houston, Texas. Accessories or equipment furnished by WPI, but manufactured by others, shall carry that manufacturer's warranty, which will be passed-on to Buyer. WPI shall not be liable for any repairs, replacements, or adjustments to the equipment or any costs of labor which will be passed-on to Buyer. WPI shall not be liable for any repairs, replacements, or adjustments to the equipment or any costs of labor performed by the Buyer or others without WPI's prior written approval. WPI will serve the Buyer by acting as Buyer's representative in regard to warranty claims for items not manufactured by WPI. However, warranty in all cases is limited to the manufacturers' warranty. Any part(s) found to be defective will be replaced at no charge subject to each manufacturers' respective warranty policy, which WPI will administer. Any part(s) replaced that are not subsequently found to be defective by the manufacturer will be charged to the Buyer. Warranty labor for replacement or repair is on site only. Buyer is responsible for travel time, transportation and expenses to and from the closest WPI location, to the location of the subjected equipment. Should WPI travel to the location and find that the cause is not warrantable, all expenses incurred by WPI, to include travel and labor, will be billed to the Buyer at WPI's posted rates. WPI will not be responsible for crane, barge, or special transportation charges associated with warranty repairs transportation charges associated with warranty repairs.

14. Literature

WPI will provide upon request, the manufacturers standard literature. This includes Spec Sheets, Bill of Materials, Drawings, Operation and Maintenance Manuals and/or Factory Test Reports. WPI takes exception to all specification requirements & requests for non-standard factory

15. Hours of Operation

This bid assumes all work will be done during normal business hours. Normal hours of operation for WPI are 8 am - 5 pm Monday-Friday. Any work performed outside of the normal operating hours will be billed at 1.5 times our current labor rate.

16. Start-Up

When factory start-up services and field testing are included as part of a quoted package it is understood that the equipment will be made available by the buyer for WPI to perform the factory services within six (6) months of shipment. Additional charges may be required for factory services performed beyond the six (6) month window. Customer has one year (365 days) from the initial ship date of a Generac generator to be started up/commissioned and filed online via GENservice. Registration will then activate the warranty start date. If the product is not started up/commissioned within the first year of the ship date, the warranty start date will revert back to the initial ship date. In addition, any product not started up in the first year must have the Long Term Preservation and Storage Procedure performed and the form completed. Forms must be submitted BEFORE the first year after the initial ship date has expired.
