City Manager, Joseph R. Pace, declared a meeting of the City Council Finance Committee duly open for the transaction of business at 6:31 p.m.

Public Comments. There were no public comments.

The first item on the agenda was to review and consider minutes from the meeting held November 14, 2022. Councilmember, Russell Machann, made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Councilmember, Larry Pittman, seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The second item on the agenda was to review and consider Proposed City of Wharton Write Offs:

A. City of Wharton EMS.

B. Utilities.

Finance Director, Joan Andel, stated to the Committee that Ms. Debra Medina from Prudentia was recommending that any account that is self-pay and had not had any activity in a year be written off. She presented the Committee the list that represents those accounts. She stated that the City Staff had checked the utility billing system to see if there were any accounts that could provide current addresses to enable Prudentia to seek further collection on any accounts that were returned with bad addresses. She stated that all of those accounts had been transferred to Linebarger, Goggan, Blair, and Sampson LLC for collection efforts to begin from our outside collectors. After some discussion, Councilmember, Russell Machann, made a motion to recommend to the City Council that the total amounts be written off of the Emergency Services Accounts Receivable and should any future collections be received, the write-off would be reversed and the payment applied. Councilmember, Larry Pittman, seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

Finance Director, Joan Andel, stated to the Committee that the Utility Department was requesting that uncollected balances from October 2021 through September 2022 be written-off due to non-payment. She stated that the uncollected balances were mainly due to customers who have moved away without finalizing their accounts. She stated that the City had applied the customers' deposit to the account but the balance remains unpaid. She stated that each of these customers had received a final bill and that the customer is not allowed to open a new utility account in the future until all utility bad debts owed to the City have been cleared. She presented the previous years' write-off for utility accounts as follows:

2017-2018 \$52,654.92

2018-2019	\$23,177.44
2019-2020	\$32,417.02
2020-2021	\$24,049.55
2021-2022	\$37,022.97

After some discussion, Councilmember, Russell Machann, made a motion to recommend to the City Council to approve the utility write-offs as presented. Councilmember, Larry Pittman, seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The third item on the agenda was adjournment.

The meeting adjourned at 6:39 p.m.

The TxDOT Staff in the Yoakum District Office have been in contact with the City in reference to entering into a Continuous Lighting Agreement for lighting to be constructed on I-69 during the construction upgrades. TxDOT is requesting that the City power and maintain the lighting to be installed from south of JM Eagle to just north of the future FM 1301 interchange. This will be an estimated total of 41 - 48' tall poles with 400-watt (equivalent) LED lighting.

The construction would be financed and completed by TxDOT. The City is being requested to provide power and maintenance to the lighting once constructed. The Staff did speak with TxDOT about the possible maintenance costs associated. Per TxDOT representatives the illumination is mounted to the top of the center barrier so there is a small chance that the poles or arms will need maintenance. It would mostly be changing the bulbs and the associated traffic control. The bulbs should last approximately ten years. The increased cost would be for the traffic control. Estimates for the traffic control necessary could be in the \$2,500 - \$5,000 per day range to give access to change the bulb(s).

After the request of Council to speak with TxDOT about a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the maintenance of the lights, the City Staff did meet with Yoakum District Staff. TxDOT is not in agreement with the MOU. It was determined that the lighting being requested to be maintained by the City is aesthetic for the City only and not required safety lighting. TxDOT is also providing the required safety lighting at each entrance and exit ramp and along the feeders as needed. The safety lighting will be powered and maintained by TxDOT. The TxDOT staff advised that if the City wished to not provide the lighting and maintenance to the lighting as requested in the agreement, these lights could be removed from the final design, so as to not impact either agency.

After discussing this with TxDOT, it is currently the City Staff's that the City Council consider executing the agreement at this time. While the lighting is only aesthetic in nature, it will enhance the future intersection of F.M. 1301 and I-69 as well as the F.M. 102 and I-69 area throughout the City Limits and provide a positive look to the City for future economic opportunities.

TxDOT staff in the Yoakum District Office have been in contact with the City in reference to entering into a Continuous Lighting Agreement for lighting to be constructed on I-69 during the construction upgrades. TxDOT is requesting that the City power and maintain the lighting to be installed from south of JM Eagle to just north of the future FM 1301 interchange. This will be an estimated total of 41 - 48' tall poles with 400-watt (equivalent) LED lighting.

The construction would be financed and completed by TxDOT. The City is being requested to provide power and maintenance to the lighting once constructed. Staff did speak with TxDOT about the possible maintenance costs associated. Per TxDOT representatives the illumination is mounted to the top of the center barrier so there is a small chance that the poles or arms will need maintenance. It would mostly be changing the bulbs and the associated traffic control. The bulbs should last approximately ten years. The increased cost would be for the traffic control. #### AGREEMENT FOR CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION OF CONTINUOUS HIGHWAY LIGHTING SYSTEMS WITHIN A MUNICIPALITY (Specific Limits)

**THIS AGREEMENT**, dated this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_\_\_, by and between the State of Texas, hereinafter referred to as the "State," party of the first part, acting by and through the Texas Department of Transportation, and the City of Wharton, Wharton County, Texas, acting by and through its duly authorized officers under a ordinance or resolution passed the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_\_\_\_, hereinafter called the "City," party of the second part, is made to become effective when fully executed by both parties.

#### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the City has requested the State to contribute financial aid in the construction, maintenance, and operation of a continuous highway lighting system on the highway designated as US 59 within the limits from 0.26 MI. NORTH OF FM 102 to 1 MI SOUTH OF FM 961 inside the City which is in accordance with 43 Texas Administrative Code, Section 25.11. Within the City, said lighting system hereinafter referred to as the "lighting system" is to consist of continuous lighting to be built in sections as financed and designated by the Texas Transportation Commission; and

**WHEREAS**, the Executive Director, acting for and in behalf of the Texas Transportation Commission, has made it known to the City that the State will construct said highway lighting system, conditioned that the City, as provided in 43 Texas Administrative Code, Section 25.11 and Transportation Code, §221.002, will maintain and operate said lighting system.

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto to be by them respectively kept and performed, as hereinafter set forth, it is agreed as follows:

#### AGREEMENT

#### Article 1. CONSTRUCTION RESPONSIBILITIES

A. The State will prepare or provide for the plans and specifications, advertise for bids, let the construction contract, or otherwise provide for the construction, and will supervise construction, reconstruction or betterment work as required by said plans and specifications. As this lighting system project is developed to construction stage, either as a unit or in increments, the State will submit plans and specifications of the proposed work to the City and will secure the City's consent to construct the lighting system prior to awarding the contract; said City consent being signified by the signatures of duly authorized City officers in the spaces provided on the title sheet of the plans containing the following notation.

MAINTENANCE, AND OPERATION OF CONTINUOUS HIGHWAY LIGHTING SYSTEM

The City-State construction, maintenance, and operation responsibilities shall be a heretofore agreed to, accepted, and specified in the Agreement to which these plans are made a part."

B. All costs of constructing the lighting system will be borne by the State, and the lighting system will remain the property of the State.

#### Article 2. MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. The City hereby agrees to furnish at its expense the electrical energy required for proper operation of the lighting system, such electrical energy to be provided at points on the illumination system as designated by the State. The City further agrees to maintain and operate the lighting system in an efficient and sightly condition, including the furnishing of all equipment and labor and making any replacements which may become necessary, without cost to the State.
- B. The City shall assume maintenance and operation on a date to correspond with the date construction of the lighting system is completed and accepted by the State. The State will provide written notification to the City of such acceptance. The City hereby agrees to furnish at its expense the electrical energy consumed by the system during the period of trial operation prior to the acceptance by the State. If the lighting system is constructed by sections, this provision shall apply to each such separately constructed section.
- C. The City will obtain approval of the Executive Director before making any major changes in the design and/or operation of the lighting system as designed and constructed by the State or before the removal of any part of the installation except for the purpose of replacement where identical or accepted equivalent equipment to that originally installed is used.

#### Article 3. GENERAL

- A. This Agreement shall remain in force for a period of two years from the date that maintenance and operation responsibilities are first assumed by the City and shall be automatically renewed for two-year periods unless modified by mutual agreement by both parties
- B. The State will not incur any financial obligation to the City as a result of the Agreement.
- C. This Agreement may be terminated sixty (60) days after the filing of a written notice by either party of a desire for cancellation. The State reserves the right to remove the lighting system upon cancellation of the Agreement.
- D. If, at any time, the City does not maintain and operate the lighting system in a satisfactory manner, the State reserves the right to either arrange for maintenance at the expense of the City or to remove the lighting system. Should the lighting system be removed due to lack of maintenance, the City hereby agrees to reimburse the State for the cost of removal.
- E. Should disputes arise as to the parties' obligations under this Agreement, the State's decision shall be final and binding.
- F. The City shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations, and the orders and decrees of any court, or administrative bodies or tribunals in any matter affecting the performance of this Agreement.
- G. Changes in time frame, character, cost, or obligations authorized herein shall be enacted by written amendment. Any amendment to this Agreement must be executed by both parties within the contract period.

- H. This Agreement shall bind, and shall be for the sole and exclusive benefit of the respective parties and their legal successors. The City shall not assign or transfer its interest in this Agreement without written consent of the State.
- I. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall, for any reason, be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision thereof and this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.
- J. This Agreement constitutes the sole and only agreement for lighting at the location described herein of the parties hereto and supersedes any prior understandings or written or oral agreement between the parties respecting within subject matter.
- K. The state auditor may conduct an audit or investigation of any entity receiving funds from the state directly under the contract or indirectly through a subcontract under the contract. Acceptance of funds directly under the contract or indirectly through a subcontract under this contract acts as acceptance of the authority of the state auditor, under the direction of the legislative audit committee, to conduct an audit or investigation in connection with those funds. An entity that is the subject of an audit or investigation must provide the state auditor with access to any information the state auditor considers relevant to the investigation or audit.
- L. At the request of the State, the Local Government shall submit any information required by the State in the format directed by the State.

#### Article 4. INDEMNIFICATION

The City acknowledges that it is not an agent, servant, or employee of the State and, thus, is responsible for its own acts and deeds and for those of its agents or employees during the performance of the work defined in this agreement.



A RESOLUTION OF THE WHARTON CITY COUNCIL APPROVING AN AGREEMENT FOR CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION OF CONTINUOUS HIGHWAY LIGHTING SYSTEMS WITHIN A MUNICIPALITY WITH TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION; AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF WHARTON TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT.

- **WHEREAS,** The Wharton City Council wishes to approve an Agreement for Construction, Maintenance and Operation of Continuous Highway Lighting Systems Within a Municipality with Texas Department of Transportation; and,
- **WHEREAS,** The City of Wharton and Texas Department of Transportation wishes to be bound by the conditions set forth in the agreement; and,
- **WHEREAS,** The Wharton City Council wishes to authorize the Mayor of the City of Wharton to execute the agreement.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHARTON, TEXAS as follows:

- Section I. That the Wharton City Council hereby approves an Agreement for Construction, Maintenance and Operation of Continuous Highway Lighting Systems Within a Municipality with Texas Department of Transportation.
